## The Christ-followers in Thessalonica

The early Christians in Thessalonica were, mainly, ordinary Greeks and Romans with a Greco-Roman approach to religion.

"...turn from idolatry to serve the living God" (I Thess 1:9)

# Greco-Roman Religion

The gods as patrons – reciprocity (e.g., Emperor worship)

More concerned with their daily bread than the Afterlife

- The Lord's Prayer
- Psalm 23
- The wrath to come

# Greco-Roman Religion

Temples are not churches
GR religion was individual, not communal
GR religion was about power, not morality

Thessalonian church known for their love for each other and their morality; evidence of God's Spirit at work.



# Greco-Roman Religion

Didn't require "relational faith" in a god

Worship and prayer was transactional.




## Their Work of Faith

To Thessalonians, Christianity looked like a form of Atheism:


like a Smart Phone with no apps



# Their Work of Faith πίστις

pistis didn't begin life as a religious term pistis is more than "believe" or "trust" pistis is closer to "faithfulness" or "allegiance"

- \* Christian
- \* \* Jesus is Lord



## Their Work of Faith

NOT like their neighbours who paid their dues to idols (false world powers),

THESSALONIAN Christians followed the ways of the true God



## Their Work of Faith

NOT like their neighbours who play by the rules of their families, friends, workplace, culture

CBBC Christians gave their allegiance to, and followed the ways of, the true God
