Psalms of Thanksgiving

Psalms of praise focus on the character of God.
Psalms of thanksgiving focus on the actions of God.


However, God's actions arise from God's character and God's character is revealed through God's actions.

Praise is an act of proclamation.

Thanksgiving is an act of testimony, "I will tell of all the marvellous"

things you have done" (Psalm 9:1).




