
A HOMETOWN BOY DISAPPOINTS HIS HOMETOWN THE JESUS WAY

Luke 4:14-30

12 March 2023 Christies Beach Baptist Church Stephen Spence Jesus leaves Nazareth as a respected local boy and returns as a **Religious Star!!!**

Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and **a report about him spread through all the surrounding country.** He began to teach in their synagogues and was **praised by everyone**. 'Do here...the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum.''



Jesus' message for the crowds in Galilee

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring **good news to the poor**. He has sent me to proclaim **release to the captives** and recovery of **sight to the blind**, to set **free those who are oppressed**,

and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.

Jesus draws an enthusiastic home crowd

When Jesus came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, as was his custom.

He stood up to read... Then he began to say to them, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled *in your hearing*." All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They said, "Is this not Joseph's son?"

The home crowd grows very ugly very fast

[just 5 verses later]

...When they heard this, all in the synagogue were filled with rage! They got up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they might hurl him off the cliff. But Jesus passed through the midst of them and went on his way.

Is this not Joseph's son!





Of course, Jesus is Joseph's son! This is not a question about Jesus' identity. It is a **claim to relational privilege**.

Juke 4:22

Jesus rebukes his hometown

Doubtless...you will say, "Doctor, cure yourself!... Do here also in your hometown the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum." ...

But the truth is...Elijah was sent to a widow in Sidon (not to an Israelite widow)...the prophet Elisha healed Naaman the Syrian (not to a Jewish leper)

Charity Begins at Home. Us first! is **NOT the Jesus Way.**

The Jesus Way #NOTMEFIRST

God loves the foreigner the outsider the sinner

The arrogance of privilege is Not the Jesus way. Repent. Believe.

We are the Chosen. BUT we are Chosen to Service, not Privilege **The Jesus Way: #NOTMEFIRST**
