
Saved by Grace, through Faith

Abraham, The Story of Faith

I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing...and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."



Abraham mostly – certainly not perfectly – took God at his word and God acknowledged that trust as the relational response God was looking for.

Our Stories of Faith

- Faith is not fundamentally about out "thoughts," "doctrines," or "beliefs." Faith is a call to trust in the promises of God in uncertain and difficult times.
- Believing is a form of risk-taking that begins in our mind and will, then gets worked our in our bodies and social lives. To live by faith was [and is] to live in trust and hope.
- Faith is a relationship...God comes to meet us, be with us, and help
 us. In that sense, faith is not something we do, or something we
 think, but more properly it is a togetherness we join by God's grace.
